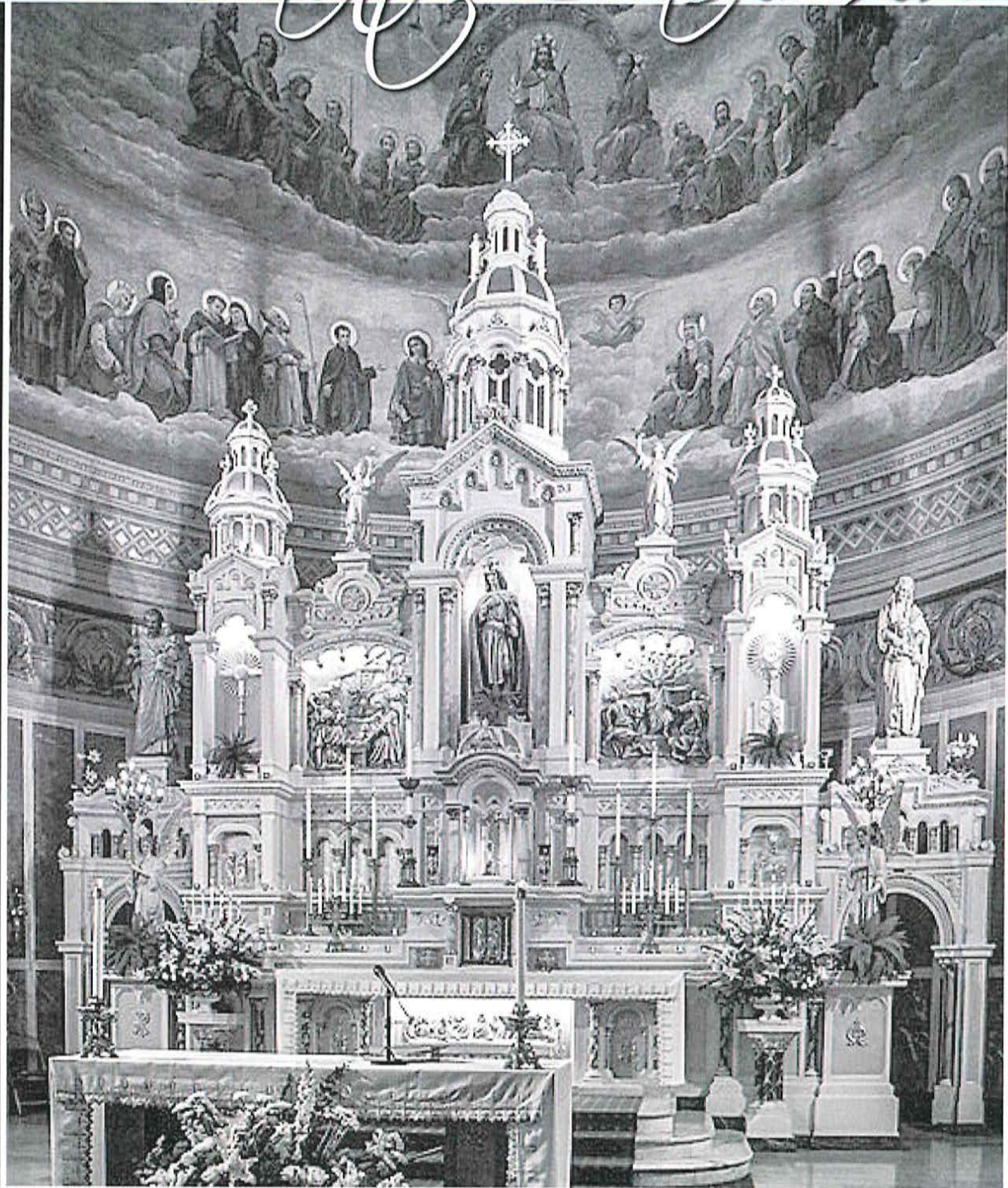

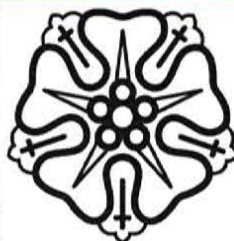

Friday, June 28th... is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. On the one hand, it is a feast day that reminds us of God's great love for His people; at the same time, it is a feast that acknowledges humanity's failure to love God fully in return. Without the Savior loving both us and the Father to the end, we would not be redeemed. Not only did Jesus willingly lay down His life for our salvation, but also He allowed His very heart to be pierced by a lance. With that final act of man's rejection of the Father's love, God could have poured out judgment upon the centurion and upon the whole world for the death of His Son. Instead, God willed that blood and water—symbols of the Eucharist and Baptism—should flow from Christ's wounded Heart to bring healing and conversion to sinful humanity. No matter how many times humanity has offended and rejected God, He has always been ready to meet us with mercy and forgiveness.
