Our Annual Blessing of Vehicles... in honor of the feast of St. Elias, the Patron of all forms of transportation, will take place TODAY. This will be conducted in our usual, popular, "drive through" manner. All forms of transportation are welcome and, as in the past, we will conduct the blessings immediately following Mass from the side steps of the School. People are requested to drive through the main gate, get their vehicle blessed, and head out through the side school gate. The Feast of the Assumption of Mary... is celebrated on August 15th. This is a popular holy day observed with great festivity in Poland where the famous "walking pilgrimages" travel from throughout the country arriving at Jasna Gora (Czestochowa) for the celebrations. This year, as that date falls on a Saturday, our observance at St. Casimir will take place at the Vigil the evening before, FRIDAY, AUGUST 14TH at 7PM. At the conclusion of Mass, we will also have the traditional blessing of flowers and herbs which everyone is invited to bring with them from home. A part of the Church's ritual since the 10th century, this custom both honors Our Lady's Assumption into Heaven and marks the beginning of the harvest season invoking God's blessing upon the bounty of the Earth.
