2021 MASS INTENTION SCHEDULE

Our Mass intention schedule opens for this year beginning with Holy Week and Easter, with Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper on April 1st at 7PM, Holy Saturday's Easter Vigil on April 3rd at 8PM and Easter Sunday on April 4th with the *Rezurekcja* Polish Mass at 8AM and the 11:30AM Solemn Mass. The rest of the calendar year of Sundays and Holy Days follows up until we begin a new Mass schedule with Palm Sunday of next year, 2022.

Everyone interested in having a Mass offered at St. Casimir for the intentions of either deceased family or friends or the special intentions of those living, should write down their names and submit them along with the Mass offering by dropping them into the collection basket, mailing them in, or giving them to Father in the Sacristy. If there are any special dates which you would request, every effort will be made to honor them on a first come, first serve basis. Any intentions submitted during the course of this past year will be included on this schedule.

NEXT SUNDAY there will be available a preliminary schedule for review noting those dates which already have intentions and those open dates still remaining. This has always been an inspiration for people to come forward and get their intentions scheduled.

SOME SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS...

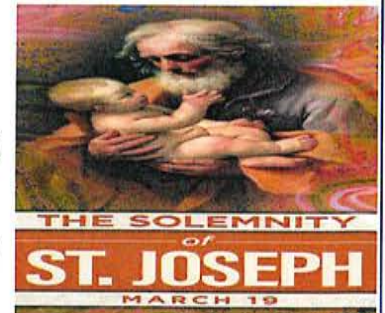
