Thoughts From Cardinal Wyszynski

As we prepare for the beatification of the great "Primate of the Millennium", Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski, on September 12th, we will offer daily reflections taken from his writings and sermons...

August 29th - *How few people are willing to stand by a man who is being tried; How very few will stick by him to the end! In such situations one learns the worth of a man.*

August 30th - *As a nation grows out of past generations, so the history of a nation is nourished by the past.*

August 31st - *Everything - in its own time!*

September 1st - *There is no injury, such, that cannot be forgiven.*

September 2nd - *As grass holds the flying sands in order that storms not blow them away, so a nation must hold on to its native soil with its whole heart and soul - bind itself to it, and , not allowing itself to be disinherited, safeguard its freedom and its place on the map of the world.*

September 3rd - *Do not let us put on the glasses of contemporaneity to judge the past.*

September 4th - *From the moment that Christ suffered death on a cross, no longer can a decree, or suffering, or the cross dishonor us. How many holy people are considered criminals, and how many criminals conceal themselves behind a toga of greatness and respect.*
