As we prepare for the beatification of the great "Primate of the Millennium", Stefan Cardinal Wyszyński, **NEXT SUNDAY**, we will offer daily reflections taken from his writings and sermons...

September 5th - *The contemporary world - humanity, the Church, and every private family and our Motherland - need maternal arms and a maternal heart.*

September 6th - *Let us not fear for the Church, lest, if it enters too much into human life, it will get a bit soiled. The Church is a Church of sinners and saints, a church of wheat and weeds, a Church divine, indeed, but also - human.*

September 7th - *The world is a bit feast, prepared with all His gifts, by the good God. Entrance into the world requires skill in making good use of these gifts.*

September 8th - *One can be a good man without being a Christian, but one cannot be a good Christian without being a decent man.*

September 9th - *A person is responsible not only for his feelings toward others, but also for those feelings he arouses in others.*

September 10th - *Real purity enables us to love.*

September 11th - *To give life, a woman must be a mother; but to bring it up in a way pleasing to God, she must remain virgin in spirit.*

September 12th - **BEATIFICATION DAY - 12 NOON ...** "A day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." Alleluia!
