



<u>May 3rd</u> <u>Polish Constitution Day &</u> <u>Feast of Mary, Queen of Poland-</u>

While it will largely be observed today - the Sunday closest to the actual date - May 3rd marks the anniversary of the signing of the 1791 Polish Constitution - the first of its kind in the world after that of the USA's. And, since its restoration as a free nation in 1918, it has also been observed liturgically as the Feast of Mary, Queen of Poland - hearkening back to the days of King Jan Kazimierz, the Marian Vows of the Nation, and the crowning of Our Lady in Jasna Gora as the nation's Queen. Join your fellow parishioners at the Parma Observance this afternoon. Parade starts at 3PM. Festivities at the Unity Credit Union Lot on Ridge Road south of Snow.
