**GOSPEL REFLECTION**

It also calls us to keep open the doors of love between our brothers and sisters with the power that comes with forgiveness. If in one's darkest hour they can find the resolve to fervently pray this perfect prayer of Jesus' conviction, then there is no doubt that God will hear their plea, reach out in love, and bring them ever closer to His heart. What more does one need to weather the storms of life besides faith, hope, and love? These are God's most perfect gifts and all we really need.

**Patron Saints of Grandparents, July 26th**

We have ancient traditions and some apocryphal sources for the stories of their life, but nothing from public revelation. 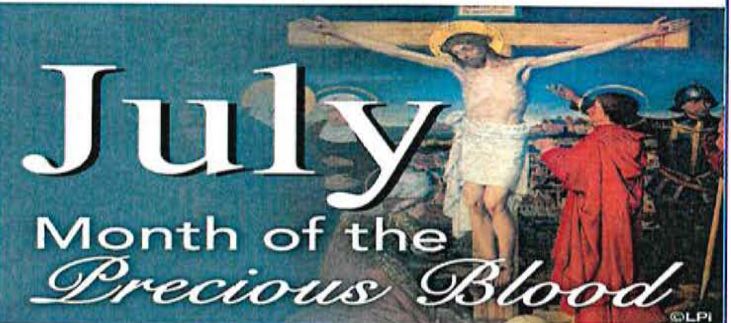
## **SOME SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS...**
