St. John of Capistrano - October 23rd

St. John was born at Capistrano, Italy in 1385. He studied law at the University of Perugia and King Ladislas of Naples appointed him governor of Perugia. During a war with a neighboring town he was betrayed and imprisoned. Upon his release he entered the Franciscan community at Perugia in 1416. He was a student under St. Bernardine of Siena, who inspired him to institute the devotion to the holy Name of Jesus and His Mother. John began his brilliant preaching apostolate in 1420 and he traveled throughout Italy, Germany, Bohemia, Austria, Hungary, Poland, and Russia preaching penance and establishing numerous communities of Franciscan renewal. When Mohammed II was threatening Vienna and Rome, St. John, at the age of seventy, was commissioned by Pope Callistus III to preach and lead a crusade against the invading Turks. Marching at the head of seventy thousand Christians, he gained victory in the great battle of Belgrade against the Turks in 1456. Weakened and exhausted, he died three months later at Illok, Hungary. In California at the mission dedicated in his honor, each year on the Feast of St. Joseph - as the song says - the "Swallows come back to Capistrano" and it is a festive day of prayer and celebration for all - as the picture below illustrates!

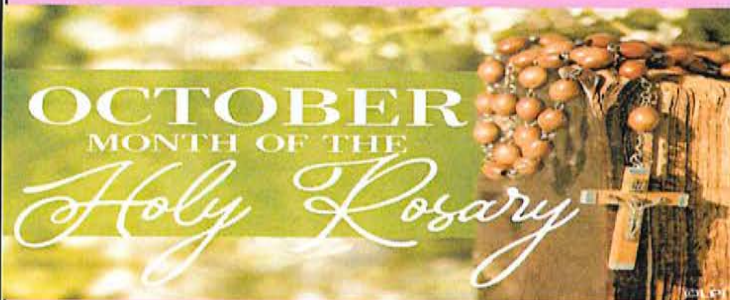
