An Unexpected Devotional Development...has been hoisted upon us with the substantial increase in the cost and shipping of the devotional "vigil" lights that we burn throughout the church. We were able to postpone this effect by tripling our order last time, but that supply has expired. While not intended to be a fund raiser, we cannot afford to lose money offering this important & meaningful devotional tool. Our Parish is left with no choice but to raise the price for each of the large, multi-day candles from \$3 to \$4 effective JANUARY 1st. The cost of the smaller candles and Sanctuary Lights remain the same for now. We ask your understanding in this matter noting how the current economic situation has gone so far as to even effect our devotional lives and practices,

#### SANCTUARY LAMP INTENTIONS

Special envelopes are now available for "reservation intentions" for the two Sanctuary Lamps - the red ones which burn continuously on either side of the Tabernacle. Cost for each lamp is \$10 and the intentions will be printed in the Parish Bulletin, as well. Each week when the lamps will be lit a prayer will be offered for the intention requested.
