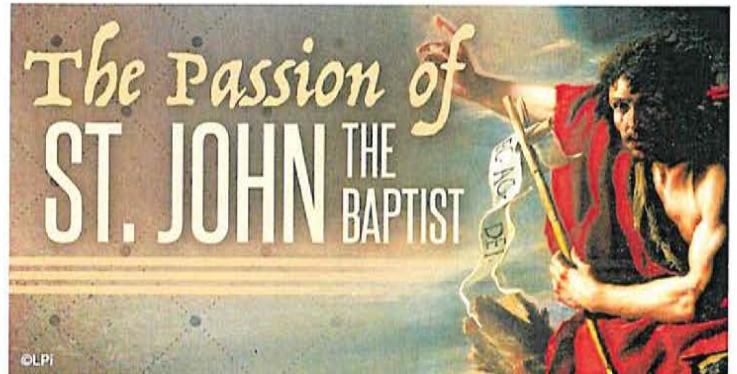

**Passion of St. John the Baptist - August 29th**

How did Saint John the Baptist get to be strong enough to speak the truth, even when he knew that it could mean the end of his life? John constantly preached and practiced penance. Like the Old Testament prophets, Saint John fasted in the desert so that he would be strong enough to speak the truth.

If we practice penance in our lives, we will be strong enough spiritually to stand up for the Truth, who is Jesus. This is what our world needs and this is what St. John did - and it allowed him to make this last and greatest act of witness to Jesus.
