Our Palm Sunday tradition is back with this year's Alumni Pancake Breakfast on March 24th from 10AM - 2PM. Prices for adults are \$15 and include the expanded menu of 3 fresh-flipped pancakes, 3 hot-off-the-griddle sausages, eggs, hashbrown potatoes, a fruit cup and juice. Children's portions (6-12) are 2 pancakes, 2 sausage, fruit cup and juice for \$7. Children 5 and under get one pancake and one sausage FREE. Look forward to seeing you there!
