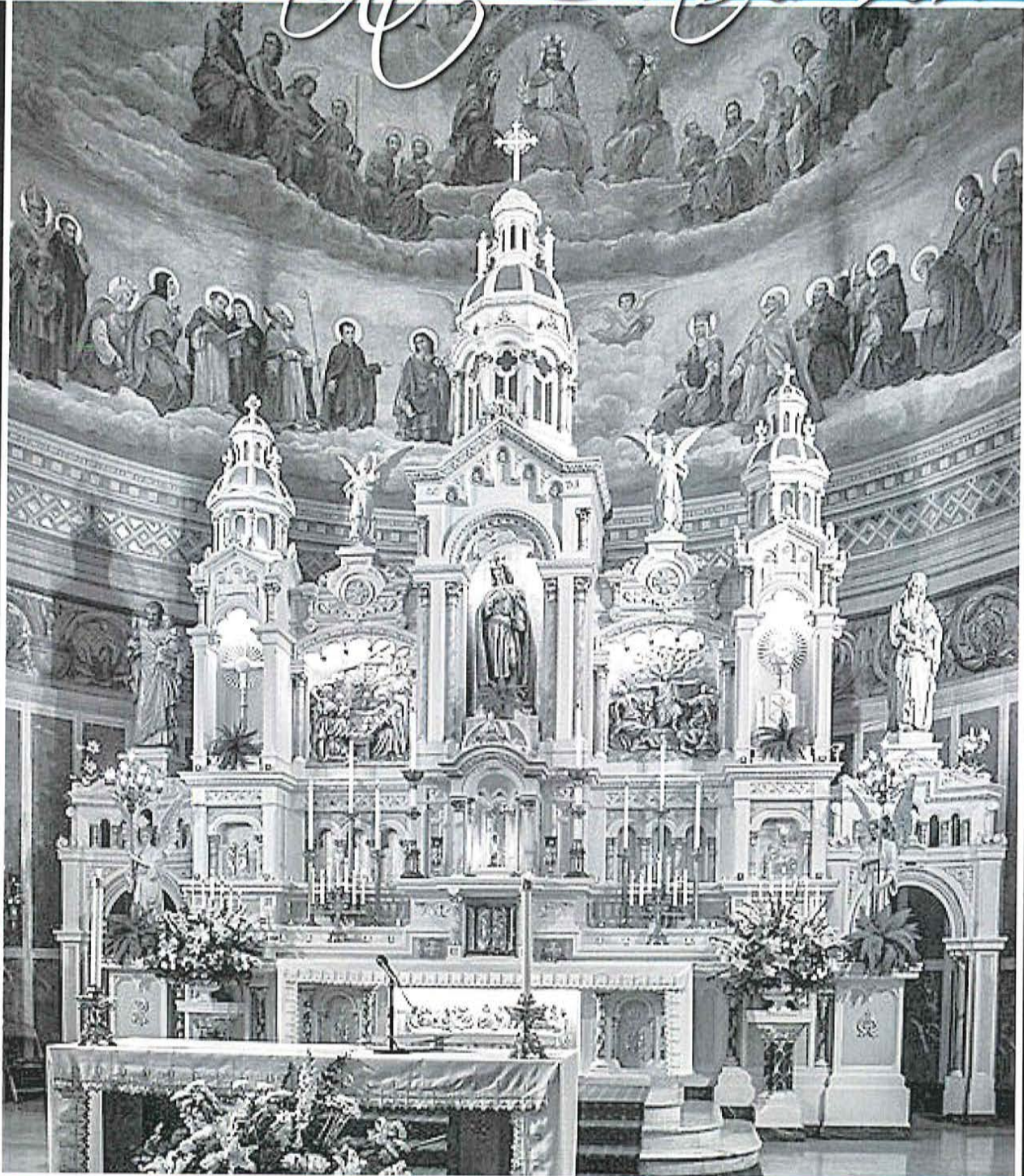

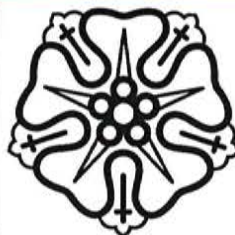

EASTERTIDE

Feast of the Ascension of our Lord, May 16th

Mass will be offered at 11:30AM celebrating the completion of our Lord's earthly mission and His return in glory to the right hand of the Father. This Feast also incorporates the Church receiving its "job description" as Jesus instructs us all to "go, teach, and Baptize all nations."

Feast of Pentecost, May 23rd

Our 11:30AM Mass celebrates the "birthday of the Church" on this fiftieth day after Easter when the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles to enliven them for proclaiming the Good News to the ends of the Earth.

Trinity Sunday, May 30th

Our 11:30AM Mass observes today the foundational mystery of our Faith: that God is one but in three distinct persons—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Feast of Corpus Christi, June 6th

Out Solemn celebrations begin with a festive Mass at 11:30AM followed by Eucharistic Devotions at the main altar. From there, we will have the traditional procession to the three decorated altars around our campus: at the Convent, the School, and concluding at the Grotto. Services will alternate between English and Polish. We're one of the few parishes that still observes this wonderful tradition. JOIN US!!!
